Leadership Team Meeting Summary

Leadership Team has tabled voting on creating a new church website with an outside company we met with. Instead, we are giving Randy Anderson and Jim Craner an opportunity to come up with a new website on their own. The current site that is hosted through the United Methodist Church will no longer exist at the end of the year. We will be updating the congregation on the website changes soon.

Also, Leadership Team will be working on updating staff job descriptions and duties. A task force will work on these descriptions outside of Leadership Team meetings.

Outgoing Leadership Team members and new members taking their place in 2026 will be recognized and announced in January during service.

Important dates:

- Advent/Christmas Eve information: Hanging of the Greens (Worship team leads) will be after church on November 23rd the week before Advent begins (Contact Lorna about the big wreath).
- December 21st—Blue Christmas service for those in our congregation and the community who have experienced a loss or hardship that makes the holidays difficult for them. Pastor Melissa is reaching out to other churches and organizations with an invitation to attend this service and a meal afterwards.

Vicki will need a headcount ahead of the service.

- Northwest UMC staff will be recognized on Sunday, December 23rd during church. As in the past, staff will be receiving a gift from the church at that time.
- Christmas Eve: Services at Prospect UMC will be at 6pm—Northwest UMC will be 7:30pm. Congregations from both churches can attend which ever time works best for their family.

Blue Christmas

Not everyone looks forward to the holidays. Holidays can trigger tough memories: memories of losing our loved one. This might be your first holiday without your loved one or the umpteenth one without them. This Blue Christmas service is a candle-light vigil that holds space for both hope and for our fears, our grief, and our sadness.

The service will be followed by a dinner to provide extra tender, loving care for the attendees during this time of year.

Intergenerational Advent Series

Wednesday evenings during Advent, we will be gathering at 5:30pm.



On Wednesday, December 3, we will gather at Northwest in the sanctuary for a Chrismon service. Chrismons are symbols that tell the story of Jesus. We will have scripture readings and carols as we decorate the tree with Chrismons.

On Wednesday, December 10, we will gather at Prospect in the sanctuary to pray, light candles, and hear about the preparation for the birth of Jesus from John the Baptist. Afterward, we will gather in intergenerational small groups to reflect on the story, make hope luminaries, and frost and eat cookies.

On Wednesday, December 17, we will gather again at Northwest to pray, light candles, and hear Mary's story of God being with her which is a comfort in her fear to share with Joseph her news of being pregnant. Again, we will gather in intergenerational small groups to reflect on the story and make stars of courage.

Advent Worship

What do you fear?

Have you ever really sat with the opening lines of Luke's Gospel that begin Jesus' story with the words, "In the time of Herod..."? We are immediately introduced to Jesus' setting into which he is born: a fearful world filled with oppression, economic disparity, uncertainty, and instability. Throughout space and time, the angels in the stories of Christ's birth whisper the surprising message, "Do not fear." In our "What do you fear?" Advent worship series, we will hear Mary, Joseph, the magi, the shepherds, and others hold on to courage and trust in God's good news for all people as they hear God's call on their lives, and acknowledge their fears and move through them. This Advent, we will learn from the stories of Jesus' birth how we might form a different relationship with fear, asking ourselves if we might acknowledge fear without letting it rule us and how we might catalyze our fears into love and action. By doing so, we might just be able to see more clearly how God is breaking in and where God is at work. This Advent, we remember that hope that trembles is still hope. This season, we will insist on hope and trust that good news is greater than fear.
